## **Anzac Day Memorial Service 2010**

As the solitary candle flickered its last glow of light as if in harmony with the breaking of dawn all heads were poised and ready to be bowed as the last post sounded through the respected stillness of our streets and Col Mackenzie's 'The Ode' still lingered in our thoughts. Everything was at peace. The Gunfire Breakfast which followed was enjoyed along with tales of mirth and bravery of those present and past.

The dawn service had ended to be followed by the quiet respected hum of the 11am Ceremony.

The Grassy Bottom Singers began proceedings with a song of tribute to our lost committee member and much respected friend the late Councillor David Clement. A sincere welcome was delivered by returned Veteran David Watkins. Following addresses were read with the same heartfelt honesty. The roll call of the fallen were individually named with sensitivity by Indi Douglas and Shannon Rosskelly, as Brad Mitchell's drum beat and Jesse Young's assistance added to this poignant moment. All were accompanied by the light touch of Don Ives keyboard and the beautiful voices of Rita and Ian Summers. The Cenotaph was draped by the rich colour of flowers which added to its respected demeanour, as all wreaths were laid with reverent contemplation.

Thank you to Peter Mackie the president of the Vietnam Peacekeepers – Peacemakers Federation of Tasmania who understood what our committee was planning to achieve for St Marys and gave us a gratuitous cheque from his organisation to the value of two hundred dollars.

Peter, a returned Veteran also delivered one of the moving addresses, along with Councillor Reon Johns, Rod McGiveron, and Wendy Fowler who delivered the Anzac Hymn. Thank you to Sister Lorraine Groves and Envoy Melanie Norton who lead the gathering in prayer and to the Targett family for letting us keep with tradition by allowing us to play the recorded last post by the late Selby Targett.

To the St Marys Memorial Association Committee - Mary and Bill Targett; Mary your organisational skills are exemplary, Kim and David Watkins, Wendy Brennan, Reon Johns and Wendy Fowler who have all worked tirelessly to continue a revered tradition in St Marys.

Finally, to Police Officer Michael Spalding and to the community of St Marys whose numbers at both the dawn, at least 50 and the 11am, over 150, have shown their support by attending, and in doing so keeping the ANZAC spirit alive in St Marys.

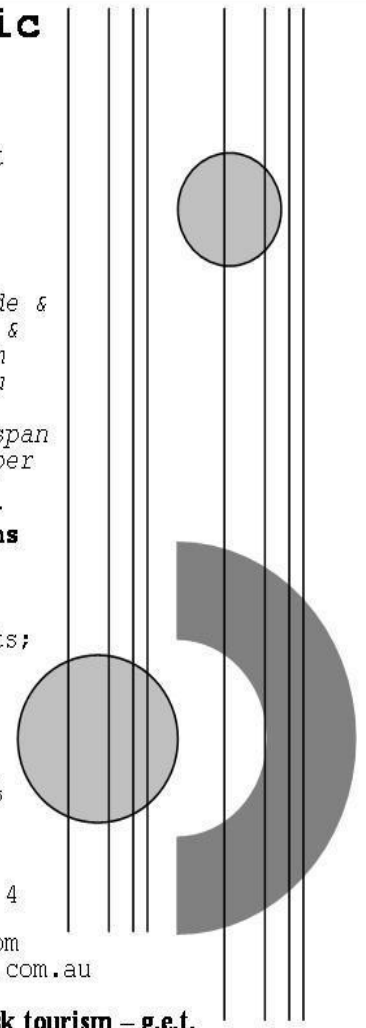

## A LITTLE BIT OF HERITAGE: Jim Haas “Van Diemens Land’s first Germans”

Today Australia is one of the most multicultural countries in the world, mainly brought about by almost two hundred years of Government assisted immigration programs, which were first introduced by England around 1831 and then carried on by the Australian Government after Federation in 1901.

In the first twenty years or so of assisted immigration to Van Diemens land, immigrants predominately came from the British Isles. But when transportation of convicts ended in 1853, cheap labour was still desperately needed for Government projects, as well as working on the settler’s farms. This prompted England to extend their recruiting program to Germany. At that time Germany and England were the best of friends and it was common knowledge that ordinary Germans were dissatisfied with economic, political, social and religious issues being forced upon them. To add to this, young men were taken from their families and sent to the front line of conflicts they knew nothing about. Most would never return.

Agents employed by a German company headed by Wilhelm Kirchner covered the length and breadth of Germany, publicising immigration to Van Diemens Land. All but £5 of their fair would be paid and the only condition was that they would have to work for a period of two years for a property owner, which would be designated by the Colonial Government.

Early in 1855, the first German assisted immigration recruitment was finalised and 858 Germans arrived in Van Diemens Land that year.

The first ship to arrive in Hobart on the 24<sup>th</sup> May was the *Lewe Van Nysenstein*. The *America* followed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> July, the *Wilhelmsburg* on the 26<sup>th</sup> August and the *San Francisco* on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November. Also on the 28<sup>th</sup> May the *Montmorency*, carrying 134 Germans, arrived in Launceston. It is interesting to note that both the *Montmorency* and the *America* sailed from Liverpool on the eastern side of England, while the remaining three ships sailed from German ports.

The most significant of these ships for our Fingal Valley and East Coast was the *America*. After her arrival in Hobart, some twenty families were put on board a coastal trader and brought up to Falmouth where they were unloaded onto Mariposa Beach and sent to work on farms in the Fingal Valley and Falmouth area.

Among those were the Lohrey, Haas, Rubenach, Lehner, Langdon, Wagner, Strochnetter and Schmidt (Smith) families. These names speak for themselves as to how important this particular influx of Germans was to the St Patricks Head District.

Small numbers of Germans continued to arrive in Tasmania after 1855, with another influx arriving in Hobart on the ships *Victoria* and *Figaro* in 1870. On board the *Figaro* was a young man by the name of Julius Aulich, who made his way up the East Coast to eventually settle at Irish Town and build the first mechanical sawmill at Mill Ridge in the foothills of St Patricks Head in 1884.

The majority on the 1870 German arrivals settled in an area called Sorell Creek some 18 kilometres north-west of Hobart. There they established berry farms and sawmills, and a German community developed to the extent that when a town was proclaimed in 1881, it was given the German name of Bismarck. A similar situation happened in 1855 with the Germans who arrived on the *Montmorency* in Launceston. They moved to an area some 26 kilometre north-east of Launceston which became known as German Town.

For many years the Germans were looked upon as hard working, respected members of their communities. World War One however, changed the thinking of many people and quite a lot of detestation was levelled at German born citizens. This caused the changing of surnames to the English spelling or punctuation. Also the names of towns were changed; German Town became Lilydale and Bismarck, in the south, was changed to Collinsvale, after the nearby mountain Collins Cap.

To look back now, one can only wonder at what turmoil must have existed in Germany in the 1800s to force families to uproot and travel to the other side of the world to start a new life with virtually nothing. Most made the best of the situation, however, and developed industries and a way of life that enhanced the general well-being of their new country. Their contribution to the Fingal Valley, and indeed the Tasmanian community as a whole, should always hold a special place in our heritage.
