The Legges

Another significant chapter in the history of the Fingal Valley closed last month with the announcement that Robert Legge was retiring from all forms of Local Government.

You would have to go a long way in any Australian Shire to find a person with 47 years of service, particularly when 13 of those years were served as Mayor. Over that time the Fingal Valley and East Coast has seen some dramatic changes, many of which have been somewhat controversial, but Robert always stood up for what he believed was right for the Community regardless of the popularity of his decision. His leadership through good times and bad has been second to none, we only have to look at the recent floods and road closures to see how he stood up for Break O'Day and handled the media. In the 2006 bushfires he became the face of the East Coast and handled it with complete professionalism.

Almost half a Century of service to the community by the current Robert is a culmination of four generations of the Legge family's contribution to the development of the Fingal Valley. Robert's great, great, great grandfather, Robert Vincent Legge, who arrived in Van Diemens land on board the ship *Medway* in 1827 was granted 1200 acres of land in the Break O'Day Plains by Lieutenant-Governor George Arthur. Robert left his five sisters, who had travelled with him from Ireland, in Hobart and made his way up through the midlands, into the Fingal Valley and took up his grant at the eastern end.

Along with a small herd of sheep and a couple of convict servants, Robert was said to have camped in a hollow log beside the Break O'Day River until he was able to build a more substantial dwelling and begin to clear his land for farming. One can only imagine the harshness of the times, but Robert was a determined man and soon established himself

enough to marry Elizabeth, start a family and build a settlement he named "Cullenswood" after his family home in Ireland.

By 1845 Robert had built a fine homestead at "Cullenswood" and by 1847 the property was complemented with a fine Anglican Church which soon became the central point of the district. In no time a small village with a number of cottages, hotel, school, blacksmith shop and a Catholic Church sprung up around the entrance to "Cullenswood".

The next Legge to make a mark was Robert and Elizabeth's eldest son William. As a lad he was sent home to England to school and after joining the British Army, became a Colonel where he served in India and played a leading role in establishing Hobart's Kangaroo Point Battery in the 1890s. He returned to "Cullenswood" in the early 1900s and worked tirelessly for the Church and the community. One of his major projects was to improve medical facilities in the Fingal Valley. Colonel Legge died in 1918, but his work was continued by his son Robert William who was honoured by laying the foundation stone for the new St Marys Hospital in 1927.

It is also worthy to note that out of the first European settlers to the Fingal Valley only the Legge family still remain on the original grants. Some historians, however, will argue that "Benham" and "Malahide" would be in that category, but "Benham" was originally granted to a Captain Grey, not Roderick O'Connor and William Talbot, the first grantee of "Malahide", had no children of his own and the property was left to his nephew.

There comes a time in all our lives when age catches up and we find it necessary to slow down, it's obvious that time has come for Robert Legge. His role and that of his ancestors in community leadership is, surely, worthy of the highest recognition. We can only hope now, that the next generation of Legges can see their way clear to carry on the family tradition, one can not imagine our community without their leadership.

Re: the forthcoming Council elections.

I note that nominees will soon be called for those proposing to stand for election to the Break O'Day Council. Tasmania, like many places in the world is undergoing major economic and social change and is currently in a recession that is affecting every area and person in one way or another. Although Tasmania has roughly the same population base as Canberra, it is a regional one, spread over a larger land mass and has little or no infrastructure which is a vital factor for the future. Councils therefore are not only the very nucleus of the area they serve but are actually an important part of the whole governmental structure

The job they do is absolutely critical to the economy and wellbeing of the people they serve. They are in a position to assist and help develop new ventures that could provide vital jobs, be innovative in adjusting to problems that climate change is bringing, assist each of the towns within their province equally and fairly and serve their constituents in ways that are constructive and not self-serving. I have lived in many places throughout Australia both regional and urban and am familiar with what I call the "big frog in a little pond" syndrome where some people, once they are in a public position of perceived importance, unfortunately take themselves instead of their job a little too seriously.

As a constituent of the Break O'Day Council, I would like to know exactly what platform and policies each person standing for Council intends putting forward. I want to hear policies that are substantially longsighted with a plan and a vision for the future, not just for one specific area, say St Helens, but for all areas and towns. It is very tempting for Councilors residing predominantly in one area to be a little one-eyed when dealing with matters before Council instead of looking to the good of the whole.

One critical issue that absolutely needs to be addressed with a plan of action is the constant closure of St Marys Pass after heavy rain. Councilor McGiveron expressed his concern most eloquently on Leon Compton's morning radio show on the ABC earlier this week. The closures this year of both the St Marys and Elephant Passes cost businesses in both the townships of St Marys and St Helens quite dearly. Small towns and small businesses are the backbone of regional Tasmania and whatever affects them affects every person living in the area they support. There are tough times ahead for every citizen living in Tasmania as the current economic crisis within Tasmania is not going to go away in the near future; there are huge problems to be faced. One definition of insanity is to keep doing the same things over and over again expecting a different result. We are in a new age now where the old industrial age paradigm is completely useless to the needs of now and the future where we need a new kind of thinking and working.

Councils can not only play a vital role in reconstruction and recovery of Tasmania as a whole but can actually lead the way with good policies and planning, support and a strong vision for the future. The Councilors we elect need to not only promise these things but actively work to deliver them and be accountable to the people they serve in the process. Elizabeth Elliott.

ST MARYS. YOU ARE BEING TOLD AND YOU HAVE BEEN WARNED. PLEASE TELL A FRIEND, SO EVERYONE KNOWS AND UNDERSTANDS. NOW.

DO NOT COMPLAIN AFTER THE EVENT. (End of September) IT WILL BE TOO LATE FOR THIS TOWN.

By now, I hope most of the residents of St Marys and anyone that does any shopping or business in St Marys are aware that the current <u>45 degree angle parking</u> on the southern side of Main Street St Marys, the side where approximately 90% of the shops between Cameron and Story Streets are located, is according to DIER & Council "No longer an option" and it <u>will be changed</u>.

There are TWO (2) proposals for parking, (parallel or 30 degree angle parking) they are both posted for inspection at the St Marys Library and Post Office and copies are also available at these locations.

I have been told by council staff that the above proposal(s) will be advertised (or possibly have been, by the time you have read this) and you will then have 30 days to place any **submissions** (arguments against/alternatives) to council by approximately the end of September.

A vote will be taken at a community meeting at a point in the future.

The plan receiving the majority of votes being accepted by council and implemented. I do not have a problem with some of the safety measures imposed or the fact that we may get a decent footpath (streetscape)

However, if you were down Main Street on Wednesday 24th (between 11 & 4) or Saturday morning, 27th of August, you witnessed the **parking future** of St Marys (for the southern side of the street.)

With a maximum of 15 parking spots being offered, (currently there are 30) these parking bays would have been filled or exceeded on what I thought, were slow traffic days; at a quiet time of year.

On busier days you will have to park on the other side of the street, after you go around the block, if you can get one there, that is.

If either of the current plans are accepted, I have grave concerns that many St Marys businesses will not survive and there is a high possibility that this community may not



I can't believe we are still arguing the point on this Forest Agreement issue. I can't believe the greenies either. How much of the forest do they want locked up? I understand under the new provisions that 430,000 hectares will be protected for the future. That's an awful lot of bush let me tell you. Around 40% of Tasmania was already protected before this so how much will it be after this? Despite this fact they want more. I think it's around another 100,000 hectares or so. You're a greedy mob you greenies, I sometimes wonder if the so called conservative groups will ever be happy until there is no timber industry of consequence anywhere in this state of ours. I also have grave fears that the current discussions and agreements will go much further or last in fact. At least one or two greenie groups will not commit to leaving the timber companies alone in the future.

We all appreciate that the timber industry itself needs much revision and to a degree needs to re-invent itself somewhat to have a real chance of a fully sustainable future but I think perhaps the Conservation Movement in all it's guises needs to do exactly the same thing. In numerous cases this mob seem to think they know it all, even in regard to the timber industry itself. They don't. They can't.

Maybe before anything is signed there needs to be a fully independent assessment on the operations and objections of BOTH SIDES to try and reach outcomes that will serve both causes well. Those priorities are obvious. Number one would be to find and identify forests that are either of World Heritage significance and old growth forests that have genuine reasons such as rarity, flora and fauna disruption, carbon capture and even economic inability reasons to be ever considered for timber outcomes. Once done then lock them up for perpetuity. Number two would then look at the remainder of the forests and meaningful discussions should then identify where genuine sustainable and profitable timber operations could occur and what can be done to help facilitate this. Environmental protection provisions could still be applied of course.

Why not use some cash and employ the expertise of people from countries who have successfully revised forestry practices and protection and look at what might be achieved. Just might be better than throwing vast amounts of dosh at such things as they are at present.

The key to it all is for both the greenies and timber industry to be honest with themselves as much as with everyone else. A bit like alcoholism or gambling really, in that you need to admit to a problem before you can fix it. Let's fix it.

"In this current climate of downturn, closures and transition in Tasmanian forestry, the work of the CRC for Forestry is vital," Mr Hutchinson said..

"Mr Adams claims to care about the forestry industry in this State. Here is yet another opportunity for him to speak up and find funding for the CRC for Forestry. I am looking forward to hearing what action he is going to take," Mr Hutchinson said.
