Students showcase language skills at St Marys School.

Language Perfect was originally made by a young New Zealander to help him with his own It has now grown to an all year studies vocabulary building course and includes a global competition attracting schools from America, the UK, Asia and Africa as well as several European counties and of course Australia. Last year 2011, only one of our students entered the competition. Freya Prebble came first in Tasmania with a Bronze medallion and the youngest primary student to reach this level in Australia.

Private and public schools, colleges and Universities are all part of this competition which is growing every year. Over 800 different schools competed in 2012 and divisions were based on numbers of students not age, ability or country of origin, there were close to 150,000 students. Over the ten day competition in 2012 our students really pulled out the stops and as a team we totally rocked.

Our team came 1st in French in the We came first for combined world. languages in our category in the world.

The big one though was that we came 3rd for combined languages over all categories. That is third *in the world*! Students answer questions in vocabulary, number, verb and sentence. They have to translate spoken word and written word both to and from their chosen language. Points are awarded as they get the questions right four times. They get more points by repeating them 24 hours later and again a week later. Repetition is the key... and perseverance. Our individual results show just how dedicated the members of our team were.

Lukas McDiarmid worked on Japanese, largely alone. He came 16th out of all students in Tasmania doing Japanese. But almost more significantly he came 50th in TAS for combined languages out of almost 1000 students. Yet another example of an amazing performance is the 'seventh' in Tasmania, for German - Lachlan Bradbury also alone, and mostly outside of normal class time. Lily-Mae Hayes was a bit overwhelmed by the whole thing to start with, but in the end really came through and achieved a bronze. She also came 40th in Tasmania.

With sports commitments, ballet and numerous other things that make a full life, Paris Pribil really earned her silver medal (2000+ points). She was also 18th in Tasmania for combined language and <u>ninth</u> in Tasmania for French.

Chloe Harris came 5th in Tasmania for French, and for German was actually 70th in the state. That is an incredible achievement. Melanie Guy came 4th in Tasmania for French and 4th for combined languages. "At this point the combined languages and French scores become very cohesive, as St Marys was at the top of the state and we had basically blown everyone else into the weeds" remarked teacher Heather Marshall. She went on to add "Officially there is no platinum award, I confess that I invented it to help motivate the students". It requires incredible perseverance and long hours. You begin to walk, talk and see computer screens even in vour sleep.

Freya reached her goal of Platinum and 2nd in French in this state, 2nd in Combined languages in the state. She was also 39th in Australia. Finally she ranked 90th in the whole World.

Finally we have the Elite award 10,000+ points. Leon Latt spent night and day working towards this and was of course first place in the state. He was also 8th place in Australia and 23rd in the world! Congratulations to the students. You have done vourselves, your teachers and your school proud!!

I would like to state some facts that Mr. Barry Aulich has inadvertently overlooked in his article dated 16th November, 2012.

On the 2 February, 2011 I attended a meeting with Sue Atkinson along with members of the Cranks and Tinkerers regarding applying for funding for a Cranks and Tinkerers museum. At this meeting Ms Atkinson advised that the Tasmanian Community Fund would be unlikely to approve grants for more than one application in the same area.

I was aware that the St Patrick's Head Historical Society Inc was going to apply for a grant and so was the Woodcraft Guild.

I made contact with the St Patrick's Head Historical Society Inc through one of their vice presidents, Darlene Wright, who was very supportive, to see if the society would be interested in housing some of their historical items in the St Marys Railway Station if the Council could purchase it. I can only assume that this was passed on to Mr. Aulich as he called me a few days later and said that I should have contacted him directly about this matter as he was the President.

On the 10 March 2011 I arranged to have Councillors visit the Railway Station in order that they could get a feel for this iconic piece of local history.

At the Council meeting of the 15 March 2011, I moved the motion to buy the Station and in my "submission in support of motion" paragraph three clearly states that "The History Society is keen to have a home for its amazing collection and the Station would be ideal." In August 2011 the Council invited members of local organisations to a meeting in the St Marys Hall to discuss the future of the Railway Park, the St Patrick's Head Historical Society was there led by Mr. Aulich. From this meeting a plan was drawn up and presented for comment.

There was also an expression of interest seeking any organisation who wished to use part or all of the Station. Only two organisations applied, The Cranks and Tinkerers and the History Society, who then withdrew the application. What I find fascinating about Mr. Aulich's letter is he states the Society was not able to raise the number of volunteers and it was not financially viable.

So what was the point that Mr. Aulich was trying to make??

Continuing the story of our 3 local adventurers, Allie, Fern and Emma.

Our adventures continued from Lillian and Richard's to our third farm. This farm is a couple of hours from Bonnyville, just outside the town of Mayerthorpe.

We met Wendy in Mayerthorpe and headed out to their family farm, were they breed and raise Canadian Warmblood horses. They have around 200 horses on 5 sections (800 Acres) of land. The 200 horses was a big jump from the 3 we had just been looking after.

The farm is called Touchstone, and once again we were welcomed into their family, this time it is a much bigger family. Wendy and her two brothers Chris and Ken and their 91 year old mother Mavis, have owned and ran the farm since 1974, with help from the many WWOOFers over the years.

On average there are eight to ten people most of the time but there are always friends and family visiting. They usually have a large number of WWOOfers to help with the horses but at the moment there is only we three girls and two other WWOOFers. Jerome is from France and we have a great time with him as he is still learning English, so he has trouble understanding us and we have trouble understanding him. It's quite a laugh.

The second WWOOfer is Vanessa and she is from England she has been here for two years now and manages a lot of the work in the barn as well as taking many photos of the horses and property.

We have now experienced three completely different WWOOfing places, even though they have all included horses. We have met three different families and have made many new memories, friends and life experiences. We have met people from all around the world and experienced their culture and how they live and interpret things differently.

We work hard to keep the farm running smoothly and all the horses fed. We are in a routine now that we do nearly every day, such as feeding, taking horses out of the barn and cleaning horse poo. Like every farm there are always other things to do and many things that can go wrong. We have had tractor problems, flat tires, broken fences and runaway stallions, each day is different from the last.

The snow has fully covered everything now, our coldest day so far has been -27 degrees and it is good to have some warm clothes. Emma's eyelashes even froze on that day. The snow, even though cold, is so amazing, it falls like rain but not as wet and with no sound. It is peaceful and beautiful. We are getting used to the cold weather now, we had a day that was 0 degrees and we could have walked around in our t-shirts.

While here we have eaten a variety of different foods we would not eat at home. We have eaten horse meat as well as bison liver and heart. Fern and Emma were not so keen to try the heart though, and they are foods we would not eat regularly. We still didn't get to see any bears but we did get to see a moose, they are very interesting creatures.

We have had many laughs while being here and have done many stupid things, but nothing compares to my very blonde moment I had when I ACCIDENTLY stuck my tongue to metal while licking the snow on a day that was -22, and it got stuck. I freaked out, as I couldn't get it off the metal, I had to rip it off and it hurt very much and then become swollen and sore. I suppose I had to learn the hard way this time.

We have been away now for almost 5 months and we love travelling, I'm sure we will have the travel bug now and will want to travel throughout our lives but for now we are nearly ready to come home.

We are missing everyone as well as Australian food such as vegemite and BBQ shapes. Yummy. We are coming up to the final stage of our adventure and will be heading to Banff soon to do some winter activities, snowboarding, skiing and ice skating. We are getting very excited, hopefully we won't fall over too many times. We miss everyone at home and can't wait to be back to tell all our stories. Merry Christmas to all and a Happy New Year.



Some Christmas Reflections from Childhoods Long Gone

As our family work together to prepare for Christmas, I thank God for His blessing of family and for simple things like traditions and stories that are passed on from generation to generation. My childhood was delightfully filled with traditions and stories from my mother.

Daisy Dale Farm, Lower Germantown - late December 1950's

"Christmas is so wonderful!" My mother smiled as she arranged fragrant Sweet Williams in the vase that graced the mantel piece of the farm homestead. "I've grown Sweet Williams for Christmas for as long as I can remember. One year when I was just a young girl, I grew so many I sold bunches to people in St Marys. With that money, I was able to buy my sisters a vase each", she announced proudly. "Two of the vases were meant to be given as a pair for they were a boy vase and a girl vase. I couldn't afford two vases for one person, so I gave the boy vase to Elsie and the girl vase to Clarice". I smiled - I always admired those vases in each of my Aunts' homes.

Once my Mother started reminiscing, she was unstoppable and so the Christmas stories of her childhood continued, "how hard each of us 8 children would work to help with Christmas preparations - for Christmas Day saw our family



entertain many relatives and friends. But one year, my brothers and sisters labelled me a bludger. I couldn't help it. I had a sore hand. See, I've still got the scar. Wow! Her thumb must have been almost severed so I asked what had happened.

She didn't need much encouragement to tell her story:

"Well, it was the last week of school for the year and the school inspectors were coming to St Marys to test the ability and aptitude of all students. Being shy country bumpkins, Tom, Gwen and I pleaded with Mother to let us stay home on that dreaded day. Amazingly she agreed provided we collected ferns for bedding for the pigs for Christmas. Soon Tom was swinging the fern hook with all the exuberance freedom from school could muster. Gwen and I challenged each other on who could load up their cart the fastest. Somehow, in my haste my hand and Tom's fern hook connected. My thumb was almost severed. The nearest doctor was at Campbell Town so Mother did what she had to do! Soon she was busy with needle and thread. Once the thumb was reattached, Mother made a paste of flour and water to staunch the bleeding and bind the wound together. Within weeks it was as good as new. Next year all three of us faced the school inspectors", she smiled ruefully.

"Then there was the Christmas when Gwen went missing", she recalled. It must have been traumatic, for after 30 plus years, the memory caused my mother to shudder, but she continued:

"Every year, two days before Christmas, Old Silas, the peddler would visit remote homes selling an incredible assortment of items. He carried everything in a big sack on his back. The sack was so big our brothers frightened us girls by telling us it was big enough to hold a person – dead or alive. Silas always rang a bell to announce his arrival. Father would leave his farm work to make annual transactions. We children were forbidden to get too close to that 'old gypsy'. So we stayed at a safe distance where we could look wide-eyed at the amazing articles and listen to the conversation. Every year, Old Silas would look intently at my Father and say, "Mr Newman, you can have credit anytime you want or you can take all I possess (at this point, he would wave his hands over all the items from his sack) – I would exchange it all for that little black-haired angel. My wife longs for a child and that one is perfect". His grubby finger would point at Gwen who cowered in the background. "Anytime you wish, Mr Newman, we will do an exchange", his beady black eyes stared at us and he gave Gwen a sinister, toothless grin.

Well that particular year, Old Silas came as usual. Father bought a hoe. He told Old Silas there were other things he needed, but times were hard, money scarce. "Then let us talk business, Mr Newman", the peddler suggested. He and Father moved out of earshot. This bored us children, so we moved away, but soon our attention returned to Father. Old Silas left with his big bag. Father carried a small bag of items. "I wonder what Father has bought and how he had the money to get anything, Gwen?" I asked, but Gwen did not reply - Gwen was gone! "Gwen, Gwen, where are you! I screamed." But I was met with silence. Then it dawned on me. "Old Silas has kidnapped Gwen", I shouted, panic-stricken. My fear was contagious. Soon the whole family were calling out to Gwen. Twilight began to descend, but there was no trace of her.

Father looked increasingly anxious, so he finally said, "I think I'll saddle up Dobbin and go for a bit of a ride." I knew what he intended to do. He was riding to find where Old Silas had camped for the night. He would go boldly to the old kidnapper and demand Gwen's release. How my heart soared with pride for my heroic Father. But then, the terrible truth hit me! Gwen had not been kidnapped – she had been exchanged for the items father now possessed. Father himself had made the transaction! I ran screaming my accusation at Father as Dobbin's rump disappeared down the road in the growing night-time gloom.

"What's the matter, Lin?" a familiar beloved voice asked close beside me. I turned. There was Gwen – hair and clothes covered with hay, but alive and well and free. Safely inside the house, she explained how she had crept close to Father and Old Silas to eavesdrop. She heard Old Silas say to Father that the items were his, for it was a fair exchange, and she saw the 2 men shake hands. Certain she was the 'exchange material', she hid deep within the barn of hay. She heard us call agonizingly for her, but she was too afraid to respond until nightfall. Then the darkness become more frightening than the thought of being Old Mrs Silas' adopted daughter.

The door opened and in came Father. "I've been organising the neighbours for a search party for Gwen come first light", he announced. "But Father, I'm here", Gwen said running to him for a hug. She stopped mid-stream. "Father, why a search party? You were the one who was going to exchange me for items from Old Silas," her trembling voice accused. "No Gwen, no" he said collapsing in a chair, "I would never do that." "Then how did you get the things you couldn't afford?" Phylis asked bravely. Father explained, "Old Silas knew I desperately need seeds. So we made a deal – I take the seed this year, and next year, I'll have a Christmas ham waiting for him".

Come Christmas dinner, and Mother passed our Christmas ham to Father. "Want to carve up 'Old Silas", she asked cheekily as she leaned and lovingly touched Gwen's black curls. From that time onwards, our Christmas ham was called 'Old Silas'.

Then there was the time when a couple of weeks before Christmas, newly wed Elsie made a mysterious announcement, "Ted and I will be here at 11 o'clock Christmas Day. We will be arriving in grand style. I cannot wait to see the surprise on all of your faces". She smiled smugly and tossed her head arrogantly.

Near 11 o'clock Christmas Day, the peace was broken by a distant, unfamiliar brooom, brooom sound. That strange sound grew louder by the minute. Father jumped to his feet, startled, "No! Surely it cannot be one of those new-fangled contraptions?" "What?" we asked curiously. Father's indignation continued, "No daughter of mine would dare go near one." "I will not have such a rubbishy, monstrosity on my property", he declared with venom.

"Please John dear, don't swear", Mother pleaded. But Father was adamant. "Such vile things would make a Parson swear", he fumed. All the while the brooom, brooom sound came closer. It's Elsie and Ted," Gwen realised, "and they sound like they are near Scrubby Corner". "It's a <u>motorbike</u>!" Frank and Tom declared, racing down the road to greet the source of their delight.

The rest of us just stood stunned. The brooom – br-oo-m increased. Ted was revving that machine to ensure the couple made their promised grand appearance.

But then, it came – the heart-stopping sound of trees being relentlessly destroyed. Then horrible, frightening silence! Trembling with trepidation, we ran to Scrubby Corner. A trail of flattened scrub led down the bank to the creek. We saw Ted's hat floating down-stream. But Ted was safe. There he was neck-tie askew, dashing suit embroidered with black berry bushes, gallantly helping ashen-faced Elsie from the over-turned side car. All of us, except Father, went into action patching up scratches and removing thorns.

Amidst our mercy-mission, came the sound of clip-clop. Without saying a word, Father and old Dobbin went to work retrieving the motorbike. That motorbike, which minutes before had been an object of pride, a symbol of prestige, was now dejected, scratched and dented – an object of humility. Just to add a finishing touch, Father gave the motorbike a very hard kick. He then reached into his pocket and treated old Dobbin to a very juicy apple. "Actions speak louder than words"", my mother concluded.

My reflections – Gray, December 2012

- Upon the death of my Auntie Elsie and Auntie Clarice, the boy vase and girl vase, given to them by my mother all those years ago, are now in my possession. (They were finally reunited as a pair after 50 years of separation). I fill them with Sweet Williams at Christmas time and I think of my Mother and her family.
- For over 70 years, until her death, my Mother carried the fern-hook scar. Seeing it probably inspired Christmas recollections.
- Our Christmas ham has never been called 'Old Silas', but as Peter carves our ham on Christmas Day, I picture my own Father doing likewise at family gatherings long past.
- *My late Grandfather and I rarely agreed on anything, but we did have one thing in common we knew horses were far superior to motorbikes.*
- Finally, my Mother's words still echo throughout the years "actions speak louder than words". As we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, may our actions display the spirit of the season; the reason for the season; hope, joy, peace and love. These last not only from generation to generation, but for eternity.

And the whole school in the fire truck laugh.

And the Lunch that was put on at St Marys School- the best lunch stop- plenty of great food and kids with manners- truly a great day, and great example set –well done St Marys School!

Every year we see sooo many things that are just too hard or emotional to describe, to see a child that is given a specialised walker, and becomes upright for the first time, in his or her life, to see a child whom is confined to a wheel chair, play in the park and have their first swing- all amazing stuff, brings the hardened of people to tears, to see a child who communicates by ipad- wow -what technology can bring to the lives of the not so fortunate!

We've never had a major sponsor- as to the status of industry in our area- those that could afford rejected our requests usually because they sponsored some out of area event, so our fundraising motto has always been, if we just get 400 -\$10 donations our \$4000 entry is there, (which equates to 0.25 of a wheelchair) so it's been hard work for many years. To all my consistent local sponsors - you are the people that help us do this and I can't thank you or show my gratitude enough- Every year when asked-you always give, and when times have been tough, you still find what you can afford- Thank you.

Lyons constituents are openly questioning whether Mr Adams will run again, and if so, whether he will run for Labor. "So conspicuous has he been by his absence of late, this clear attempt to distance himself from his own party will only fuel that," Mr Hutchinson said.

Mr Hutchinson that if Mr Adams felt so aggrieved by his own party that he couldn't even bring himself to mention it in his summer propaganda blitz, then he should at least have the courage of his convictions to stand up to it.

Instead, there's been barely a peep from Mr Adams at a time when the electorate has desperately needed him to try to stop the Labor-Greens minority governments in Canberra and Hobart from destroying Tasmania's productive industries and economy.

It is just further evidence of why Lyons needs a Liberal Government and the strong representation that Mr Hutchinson will provide.

Barnett to express interest for Liberals in State election

Mr Guy Barnett, will express interest for the Liberal Party to run at the forthcoming State election. The Liberal Party advertised (in Tasmania's 3 daily newspapers) (Saturday) for expressions of interest.

"Tasmanians deserve a new start. It is time to replace despondency and despair, with hope and opportunity. Record lows in investor and consumer confidence, a struggling economy, and the highest unemployment in the country. We must rid this state of the anti-development agenda that permeates the air we breathe. The Greens have been leading this government by the nose. Enough is enough.

Tasmania desperately needs some 'can do' leadership with an unequivocal growth development and jobs agenda.

The answer is a majority Liberal Government led by Will Hodgman MP.

I have been inundated with requests to run for Parliament. Hardly a day goes past without people asking and some imploring me to run.

Representing one's community is a privilege and I cherished my role as a Senator. Being part of a team to help Tasmania harness its untold potential would be an honour.

I will be expressing interest but will not make a final decision until early in 2013.


He also owned and managed his award winning government and corporate consulting business for 13 years.





Council Auction Update

Council recently conducted an auction for unpaid rates.

In the past Council has set very low reserves - from Council's point of view, this was allowing the market to set the price and taking them from a non-rate paying situation into a rate paying situation.

We have, however, recently been given legal advice which compared these sales to mortgage default sales through the banks, and requiring that Council try and get a 'fair market price' for each property. This is to ensure that Council, in achieving our desired outcome, does not do so unfairly at the expense of the former property owner.

A total of 10 properties went under the hammer. Regrettably only three of those 10 sold on the day. The remaining seven properties will remain on the market at fixed price through LJ Hooker, St Helens.

Having tested the market through the auction/ reserve process, some price flexibility is reasonable.
