Raie McGeachie 1912 - 2012

During a conversation with Len Miles back in January of this year, I learnt that Mrs Raie McGeachie was turning 100 in a couple of weeks. As 100 years in anyone's life is a tremendous feat I set about designing a special card with two purposes in mind. One was to congratulate Mrs McGeachie on her achievement; the second was to let her know that the people of Cornwall and, indeed, the Fingal Valley had not forgotten the contribution the McGeachie family made to our humble community.

John (Ding) McGeachie and his lovely young wife Raie arrived at Cornwall from New South Wales in 1941. John had recently been appointed Cornwall Coal Co. Mine Manager, after the sudden death of Mr C. S. F. Hood in late 1940. Mr Hood had been Mine Manager since 1918, but it would seem the long strikes of 1937 and 1940 took a toll on his health.

John McGeachie stabilized the industry on his arrival, but did come under some criticism for immediately working towards mechanising the mines. In 1950 he brought the first Joy continuous miner into Cornwall mine and although the Union at the time worried it would do away with jobs, the coal mines would never have been competitive into the future without mechanisation. By the time John McGeachie left Cornwall in 1959 and Jim Brennan took over as Manager, Cornwall Coal Co. mines were almost totally mechanised.

In the 18 years the McGeachies spent in the Valley they were much more than miners. Although Raie was a young mother and had three children (Helen, Duncan and Robert) while she was here she was very much involved in the community. She was a tireless worker for many community organisations, including the St Marys Players, who staged the famous, Japanese comic opera, "The Mikado" in 1954. The opera, which was held in the St Marys School Hall, ran over several nights to a packed audience of people from all over the State.

Both John and Raie had a keen interest in sport too, particularly golf at the old Killymoon course and tennis at their own private court in front of the old Manager's house at Cornwall. As well, John organised a community tennis court and playground, complete with play equipment, to be built at Cornwall for all to enjoy.

All the kids growing up at Cornwall and Mt Nicholas in the 1940s and 50s would have wonderful memories of the Christmas parties the McGeachies organized for the kids of the two towns. They would be the event of the year, complete with goodies, presents and of course Santa, played expertly by the late Keith Bullock.

Whilst John McGeachie died some years ago, Raie continued on and has never forgotten her time at Cornwall. Indeed, along with her children Helen, Duncan and Robert, she was one of the first to turn up to the Back to Cornwall Day in February 2006. A day, she said, was one of the best she had ever had.

Sadly, however, only a few months after the amazing milestone of reaching the elusive 100, Raie McGeachie passed away at a home in Canberra.

Raie was touched back in January when she received the congratulation card from the people of Cornwall on her 100th Birthday. Equally, I was touched when a few weeks later I received a thank you note. It simply said: *"Dear People of Cornwall, no congratulations have I received that has given me such warm pleasure... Raie McGeachie".*

Rest in peace Raie, you were a wonderful lady who was loved and respected by all who knew you. The contribution you and your family made to our community and the Fingal Valley Coal Mining Industry will always have a special place in our heritage.

Break O'Day Council Organisational

Structure Announcement

Break O'Day Council is in the process of finalising a number of changes to the Organisational Structure, as a result of the organisational review which commenced in late 2011. The focus of the review has been to ensure Council has the appropriate skills and resources to meet the goals of the Break O'Day Council Strategic Plan 2011 - 2015.

By deciding to implement a number of changes, five (5) employees have been advised that their part time positions are redundant following a decision to outsource the position of Municipal Inspector and the operation of the four (4) Waste Transfer Stations at St Helens, St Marys, Scamander, and Fingal. A tender for the provision of the waste transfer service has been called with significant interest. Changes at the waste transfer sites will lead to improved site management and service provisions to the community.

Another seven (7) employees have been offered the option of redeployment within the organisation or the opportunity to accept voluntary redundancy, to date four (4) employees have taken up the offer of voluntary redundancy. This is to allow for the change in the nature of work required and the implementation of a structured planned approach to work throughout the Municipality.

The Council Depot facilities at St Marys and Fingal will not close, the outcome of the reorganisation of the workforce is to enable Council to efficiently deliver quality services aimed at meeting community expectations.




