Introducing ‘The Hundred Mile Dinner’

Organised by the Break O’ Day Transition group, St. Marys group has already enjoyed two One Hundred Mile Dinners so far and we are growing; 14 guests at the first dinner and 18 at the second. This was a great opportunity to get together with people in our community and showcase and enjoy local and regional food.



Everyone brought a home cooked dish to share, and meat eaters and vegetarians alike were well catered for, being treated to delicious foods such as baked Tasmanian quinoa with vegetables and herbs, locally grown and cured ham, soups and stews, and salads with home grown ingredients and Tasmanian feta, followed by delights such as nectarine sorbet.

The idea was born in Canada when, starting in 1979, the Sooke Harbour House Restaurant near Vancouver became known for its 100 mile philosophy of eating. The owners Frederique and Sinclair Philip were inspired by indigenous foods of the region along with local fish, meats, vegetables and herbs from local farms and gardens.

More recently the concept was popularised when another Vancouver couple, Alisa Smith and J.B. MacKinnon, decided to ‘go local’ after running short of food in their holiday cabin in the north of British Columbia. They feasted with their guests on local trout, wild picked mushrooms from the forest, dandelion leaves, apples, potatoes, garlic, sour cherries and rosehips, and enjoyed the experience so much that in 2005 they made a commitment to source only foods grown within 100 miles of home. In 2007 they wrote about it in ‘The 100-Mile Diet, A year of local eating’.



The benefits are many including supporting the local and regional economy, building community, eating fresh seasonal food, reducing the food miles/kilometres that are usually associated with long distance food production and transport, reducing fossil fuel use and carbon emissions, supporting local growers, fishers, farmers, markets and food makers, and having a fun, relaxing evening sharing food with others.



Here in the north east of Tasmania we believe it is in keeping with the spirit and intention of the Hundred Mile Dinner to source food grown and produced from anywhere throughout our island state ie. regional, and local, being anywhere in Break O’Day, is even better.

Please feel welcome to come along to the next 100 Mile Dinner. Cook a favourite recipe or try something new using at least 80% of ingredients from local foods or from anywhere in Tasmania! The remaining 20% can be other ingredients preferably Australian-grown or Fair Trade. Please also bring a List of All Ingredients used and where they are from, e.g. garden, local, Tassie, and a gold coin donation for tea or coffee or homemade cordials. Dinners will be on the second Saturday of every month. Look out for our poster, a simple map of Tassie and concentric circles radiating out from near the east coast, for the current venue and further information.

Next Dinner is on Saturday 13th April, starting 5.30pm at the St. Mary’s Community Hall Supper Room. After dinner will be a screening of a wonderful Cuban film on local food production, with some surprising outcomes! COMMENCEMENT WORK ON PROPOSED SHEARWATER NEW TOWN CENTRE SHOWS CONTEMPT FOR PUBLIC

Media release

Devonport lessons being ignored

Monday 25 March 2013

The commencement of work on the proposed new town centre and shopping centre in Alexander Street, Shearwater shows contempt for the public while ignoring the lessons of Devonport said the Save our Seaside Village group today.

“The developer is showing contempt for the community by starting work but still refusing to release the plans. The development was approved by the Latrobe Council nearly six months ago but the plans have not been released despite repeated calls, said Guy Barnett, Save Our Seaside Village group spokesperson.

“This development should occur in the existing town centre. It will split Shearwater in two and has every chance of crippling the existing retailers, their employees and families in the existing town centre, said Mr Barnett.

“When will we learn the lessons of Devonport? Devonport is fragmented but now they say it should consolidate. Why then is there a plan to split our community in Shearwater? What regional Tasmanian town has two town centres?

“What are the views of Devonport's Living City Taskforce and its Chairman for plans to split Shearwater in two? Planning decisions today will have an impact on our community for decades to come. We have to get it right.

“We need development that will enhance our town and enrich our community, not an out-dated proposal that will split Shearwater in two and divide our community.

“It appears the developer who has started work on the site without disclosing the plans to the public is willing to ride roughshod over the community and in particular the wishes of over 2800 people who signed a petition against a new town centre development.

“We will continue our fight for justice and a fair go. We hope State Parliament will see the merit of an inquiry.” Mr Barnett concluded.

NORTH WEST REGIONAL HOSPITAL CANCER CARE CENTRE AND ED REDEVELOPEMENT

22 March 2013

The construction of the North West Regional Hospital Cancer Care Centre and Emergency Department Redevelopment is about to commence. *Phillip Matthews, General Manager* of Vos Construction and Joinery said it was an honour for Vos to be involved in such an important development. The development will consist of construction of a new MRI facility, a larger and completely refurbished Emergency Department, a multistorey building to house the Regional Cancer Centre including two new linear accelerator bunkers, a new main entrance to the hospital as well as general site works to complete the upgrade to the NWRH precinct.

VOS has been awarded a \$20 million contract for construction work associated with both the Cancer Centre and Emergency Department. The construction and development will employ in excess of 50 people over 18 months.

Mr Matthews said that Vos had been working hard to secure this project and was proud and passionate about being part of the overall team to construct the new Regional Cancer Centre and Emergency Department Redevelopment.

Federal Liberal candidate for Lyons
Eric Hutchinson has welcomed the
report from the Legislative
Council's inquiry into the forest
IGA, which confirms what those
who acknowledge how important
the industry is to the Tasmanian
economy have been saying for
months – it's a total sham and
should be ripped up.

"This so-called peace deal has been
absurd from the start and now we
have confirmation from the first
level of Government prepared to
offer any real scrutiny or
consultation around these reforms,"
Mr Hutchinson said.

"It's time this jobs-destroying
forest deal was declared dead and
buried. The Premier should stop
wasting time and money shutting
down an industry, especially one
that is so vital to Tasmania's
economy. Unfortunately the Labor

Party's previous support for
forestry has been thrown out the
window because of their toxic pact
with the Greens at both a state and
federal level, leaving only one real
alternative for Tasmanians who
want jobs – the Liberals."

Mr Hutchinson said it's time to
focus on the future and reverse the
damage Labor and the Greens have
done.

"Sanity must now prevail so can
put our efforts into rebuilding this
cornerstone industry in Tasmania.
It is about a truly sustainable
industry with enough 'headroom'
to manage forests in this state even
better than in the past. It's about
value-adding and high quality
timbers that are a fundamental
component of the brand that is
Tasmania, biomass from harvesting
residues and creating smart fibre
and engineered structural building
materials, like those that went into
building the world's tallest wooden
building at Melbourne's Docklands
recently."

Mr Hutchinson said it was a
tragic irony that all of the timber
used in this development was

imported from overseas
(contributing to the \$2 billion trade
deficit Australia has in wood and
wood products) when Tasmania has
resource to offer and is desperately
in need of the dollars and the jobs.

"This report is damning and
confirms what the Liberals have
been saying since for months. The
IGA is littered with inconsistencies,
supply issues, shambolic
consultations, rubberstamped
World Heritage nominations and it
believes further protest action is
likely, therefore the forestry 'peace'
deal will not lead to peace at all,"
Mr Hutchinson concluded.
