A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY RETRIEVED

With the proposed new coalmine hoping to open up in the old Valley Coalmine near Fingal, the chances are they will find a number of artefacts left behind by the miners of yesteryear.

This happened quite recently when miners re-entered the old Kitten mine, which was part of Ray Yates's Cat mine. Both mines, which are adjacent to the Duncan mine, were purchased by Cornwall Coal Co in the early 1960s and have since been part of the Duncan operation.

The main artefacts found in the Kitten were an old transformer, thought to be one of the first used in coalmining when electricity was introduced in the 1930s, and an old wooden skip. The skip is significant because it is unique in its design and style.

Unlike the skips found in mines like

Cornwall, Mt Nicholas and Jubilee, where they were emptied by a tippler, this one has a front opening gate and would have been emptied by the miner manually, end for ending the skip.

One of the most common artefacts found in old coalmines are the old type long neck beer bottles. Someone once make comment that the old miners most have been heavy drinkers to leave so many empty bottles lying around. The truth was, however, although most of the miners liked a beer or two, they only drank at home and would use their empty bottles to carry their favourite drink of cold tea to work next day.

Whilst the beer bottles will remain buried underground, the miners at Duncan saw the historical significance in the old skip and transformer and brought them to the surface, where Tony Cosier, Duncan Mine Manager,

was kind enough to donated them to the St Patricks Head & Esk Valley Historical Society.

What we do with these little pieces of mining history is unclear at the moment. But, hopefully, sometime soon another museum will be re-established in the Valley and the artefacts, along with their history, can be displayed for all to see.

Letter to the editor

The criticisms of Forestry Tasmania by Frank Giles (VV 22 March 2012) cannot go unchallenged, for fear the untruths he writes about taxpayer subsidisation finds another gullible reader.

Forestry Tasmania is not subsidised.

The Auditor General recently found that Tasmania is \$111m a year better off with FT than it would be without it

He also found FT has made \$201 million in profits since corporatisation, paid \$99m in government taxes and dividends, and invested \$414m in plantations, including \$211m paid by government in compensation for the loss of resource as a result of the TCFA.

Mr Giles much more correctly observes the forestry industry is subject to change. However, he dismisses the part played by conservation groups in damaging Tasmania's branch in overseas markets, particularly Japan. What else is the explanation of the market for woodchips from other exporting states remaining buoyant?

He applauds moves towards innovative engineered timber products like laminated structural timbers, but ignores the fact that these were outlined in Forestry Tasmania's Innovations Plan, released last year. The plan also includes the production of appearance grade peeled veneers, development of a wood pellet plant for domestic heating and biomass for energy production.

The plan was produced recognising there's likely to be reduced availability of resource from native forests, but there is still some years before plantations are able to meet close demand for solid timber.

Scouts learn skills for life but most of all they HAVE FUN.


