Who ever said our kids can't be trusted with our planet. After watching an ABC show called War on Waste recently I'd confidently say it's us that can't be trusted. The episode I watched featured plastic waste and boy was the show a fun but poignant eye opener. During the show there were kids who have ingeniously and inventively come up with some great campaigns to teach us old fogies what we're doing wrong. All with a smile on their face. I pray these fantastic youngsters keep teaching and educating us all on this shameful situation. In one part of the show they went to Bondi Beach and spread out huge groundsheets. They then trucked in nothing but plastic waste and laid it out like a giant foot. They then outlined to beach goers that this was a tonne of plastic. The presenter asked numerous people how long they thought it would take for Australia to chuck out this much 'one use' items. Most said days, one or two said a day, one I think said an hour. Even that would be horrific. This then led to the presenter revealing that in fact it was ONE MINUTE. That equates to 60 tonnes per hour every day of every week of every year. The show, War on Waste is a beauty and with some fantastic insight and input from young and young at heart maybe we really can start making a small difference in a number of ways. 

Meningococcal Disease

Things you need to know......

What is meningococcal disease? Meningococcal disease is a rare but serious illness caused by bacteria (germs) called Neisseria meningitidis. The different strains ('serogroups') of these bacteria are named by letters of the alphabet such as A, B, C, W and Y. The most common strain has changed

What are the symptoms?

People with meningococcal disease often go from feeling quite well to extremely unwell very quickly. Symptoms include fever, headache, neck pain or stiffness, drowsiness or confusion, severe muscle aches and pain, vomiting and rash (a red rash which does not fade when pressed and can become dark purple). Sometimes other symptoms can include lung infection (with fever, cough, chest pain and difficulty breathing), or severe throat infection (with pain, difficulty swallowing, and drooling). Children and adolescents can have leg pain, cold hands and feet, and blotchy skin.

How is it prevented?

Immunisation is the best way to prevent meningococcal disease with the Meningococcal ACWY vaccine

From 1 July 2018 a quadrivalent meningococcal vaccine for strains A, C, W and Y replaced the meningococcal C vaccine as part of the National Immunisation Program for all children aged 12 months. Previously Tasmanian teenagers who were born between 1 August 1997 and 30 April 2003 were eligible to receive a free meningococcal W vaccine. Population Health Services have recently established a rapid state-wide population response due to a further increase in meningococcal W cases in Tasmania. This will target all Tasmanians aged between six weeks and up to 21 years old. This includes all people born after 1 August 1997.
