#### ST MARYS SCHOOL REDEVELOPMENT

In January 2017, Architects '60ty<sup>o</sup>' successfully gained the planning and management of the redevelopment project and came up with concept plans, which were shared with the parent and wider community in March. Planning and refinement took place over the following months with the final proposal presented to the Parliamentary Standing Committee for Public Works, in July 2017. The committee conducted a visit of our facilities in preparation for the \$5.4 million redevelopment. Once final approval was received, building plans to refurbish block 1 to develop a music and performing arts centre, new canteen, update administration offices and refurbish our secondary classrooms were submitted to council. Once Council approval was received, the tender was advertised and planning began for the vacating of building 1 and the hall, with the office relocating to the Library in October and culminating with a busy last two weeks of term in 2017 as the last of the classrooms were emptied.

The successful tenderer – Fairbrothers commenced Stage 1 works in January 2018, establishing their building compound, removing windows and demolishing the toilet blocks.

Props and bearings were installed and the side walls to the Hall were removed. Earthworks commenced for the entry ramp and stairs, as well as for the extensions for office spaces at the rear of the building. Inside the building, framing up took place for the library and library pods, foyer and some of the administration and support offices. And by the end of February, we began to see how the Music room/performing arts end of the building would work, with window openings between practice rooms being created, as well as door openings and preparation for the stage. As could be expected with a building of this age, substantial issues with majority of the floor area of the building were discovered. Works were delayed slightly until the pouring of a slab took place on Friday March 23<sup>rd</sup>, and a new floor installed in the Hall. Behind the scenes, a lot of electrical and communications work has taken place, relocating switchboards and the data connection between block 1 and the current Library building.

The works have revealed what a substantial building this was at the time of its construction, with internal and external walls, even the roof of the circular former staffroom being poured cement. We have loved seeing images from the construction of the school and other memorabilia coming to light on the St. Marys Connections, St. Marys, Tasmania. Stage 2 of the redevelopment commenced during the July 2018 school holidays with a builder's compound being established around block 3 (the old typing/computer building) and all internal lining being removed. The refurbished space will include toilets, classrooms connected with operable doors, break out spaces and disabled access.

With the new administration space scheduled to be complete at the end of August, including the new canteen and performing arts centre, all services will relocate to their new home and work will commence on converting the current library space into two more classrooms.

Soon after the relocation of the office, we hope to receive the shipment of new library furniture for the Library which will now be housed in the Eastern end of Block 1, and furniture for our student/ staff common room, which is adjacent to the new canteen located in the Performing arts centre. All works are scheduled for completion by the end of 2018.





#### Valley Voice Association makes \$10 k donation to St Marys District Hospital Auxiliary

The Valley and East Coast Voice Incorporated Association, which produced the Valley Voice until the end of 2017, has made a donation of \$10,000 to the St Marys District Hospital Auxiliary.

The Association is currently winding up its operations now that the Fingal Valley Neighbourhood House has taken over the role of producing our vital community newspaper. This donation is the first step in dispersing the Association's assets.

In presenting the donation to Hospital Auxiliary Treasurer Len Miles, Association Treasurer Rod Hunt said that the Valley Voice was conceived and delivered from the St Marys Hospital in 1968. Jeff Dean, the first editor, had a scoop for his first front page – the closure of the local Cheese factory.

For fifty years the St Marys, Fingal Valley and East Coast community wrote, read, advertised in, bought and eagerly anticipated the next edition of the Valley and East Coast Voice.

A small and select group of editors drove the project – and volunteers wrote, proof read, printed, compiled, stapled and distributed each edition.

Rod Hunt said that the Association Committee were very pleased to make the donation of \$10,000 as the Valley Voice has been a product of the whole Fingal Valley and East Coast community and likewise this donation will be of benefit to the whole community through supporting the St Marys District Hospital.

"The St Marys Community Health Centre and hospital is a key part of our community – a great facility we can all be proud of." Rod also said that it is great that the Valley Voice name has been continued by the Fingal Valley Neighborhood house.

The balance of Association funds will now be directed to appropriately preserving and storing copies of the Valley and East Coast Voice for study and reference purposes. Remaining production equipment will be offered to emergency services in the Valley.

After the donation was made members of the Valley Voice Committee and the Hospital Auxiliary enjoyed an excellent afternoon tea, featuring the most amazing cream cake!

#### To the Editor,

I would like to thank the Tasmanian community for their generous contributions to The Smith Family's Winter Appeal. We are very pleased to have raised over \$4.5 million nationally to help thousands of disadvantaged children across Australia with vital support for their education.

For the one in seven young Australians living below the poverty line, keeping up at school can be extremely challenging. Family struggles at home can have a flow-on effect to a child's learning. In our daily work, we hear heartbreaking stories of children missing school because they're embarrassed about not being able to read or pretending to lose their homework because they hadn't understood what was happening in class.
