## **ANNUAL CAR AND BIKE SHOW SHINES THE LIGHT ON ST MARYS.**

Once again, St Marys has shown how dedicated people can do great things!

The 13th annual St Marys Car and Bike show attracted more than 200 entries of cars and motor bikes which were viewed by over 600 people, on Sunday 9th June 2019. The cool winter weather meant that coats and hats were the common accessories worn, and the local food shops and volunteer-run stalls were kept busy selling hot drinks and food.

Interstate visitors also came to the event, bringing their pride and joy with four wheels or two, and a steady stream of cars from all parts of Tasmania making their way along the Esk Main Road and Tasman Highway earlier in the morning, provided the chance to hear the rumble and see the vehicles in action.

“We are very happy with how the day is shaping up,” said organiser Leigh Spilsbury. “More and more people enter each year, and the viewers really enjoy talking with the owners of the cars and bikes.”

Viewers had the chance to vote for their favourite vehicles, with pedal cars being included for the first time.

## St Marys Car and Bike Show

Name the make, and I think you would find one, if not a few more, on display in St Marys on Sunday, 9th June, when the annual St Marys Car and Bike Show was held in cool but fine weather on the main street of the small town in the east of Tasmania.

Holden, Ford, Toyota, Chrysler, Mini, and Mazda were all there, and lots of other makes, too. They ranged in age from ones from the 1930's right up to recent models, along with the major names in motor bikes; Honda, Kawasaki, Harley-Davison, Norton and more.

The pros and cons of each vehicle were eagerly discussed, along with hopes of dreams of owners and wannabe-owners. Trips made then and now, restoration and preservation tales, and future hopes were openly aired, and not just by the boys! Ladies are now an equal part of the market, as evidenced by the interviews recorded and posted onto "YouTube".

The town proudly backs the event, which brings nearly as many customers as are served in the Christmas break, boosting income during a normally quiet time of the year. A variety of street stalls and the monthly market, along with most of the shops in the town being open, allow those not so interested in cars and bikes to enjoy the town's businesses. And, of course, the St Marys Hotel does a roaring trade, remaining open after the show is over.

"It is a community car show, which takes over the town for the day. We park in the middle of the street, or on the blocks along the road, so there is plenty of room to walk around the cars and bikes. There is so much variety, and never a dull moment. I enjoy talking to others about our cars and bikes, and people are there because they WANT to be there, so the atmosphere is so different to many car shows," said an exhibitor who declined to be named.

For the first time, pedal cars were also on display, and they will now become a regular part of the show. "We try to make each year a it different to the last," Jackson Spilsbury told me.

A number of awards were made at then end of the day, voted by the spectators.

The Bay of Fires netball team raised a significant amount for this worthy cause, backing up the incredibly brave girl on their team. Alongside the netball there was footy tipping and Marie Owens donated face painting time and money. Not only did the local community pitch in, but there were also fundraisers run by students and teachers within the school community.

Mrs Fyle organised a staff morning tea that raised \$70. Mrs Hodge and the hospitality enterprise students prepared a lamington drive to raise donations. They sold over 700 of these tasty lamingtons, raking in a total of \$800.

When the fateful Wednesday came around, students and teachers showed their support by coming to school with a gold coin donation and crazy hair. Every class contributed to a spiral coin line and we had fun estimating the total amount of dollars in the spiral.

This coin line added up to over \$400, an amazing feat for St. Marys District School. The hospitality group then prepared Churros to be sold before the shave started. By this time the donations had reached over \$3,000 and Monique was preparing herself for the big shave. Rachel McGiveron kindly donated her time and hairdressing skills for the event.

The whole school and many members of the community watched on as both Photjana and Monique lost their heads of hair. It was an emotional time watching the courage of these two women and there were more than a few tears in the crowd.

If a woman's hair is such an important part of material beauty then these two inspiring people have become even more beautiful by giving it up for the betterment of others who are suffering. Monique raised over \$4,000 for the Leukaemia Foundation. She and Photjana have truly inspired our entire community.

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

### PROPOSED NEW CARPARK ON THE BLUE TIER

The Friends of the Blue Tier have been negotiating with PWS for many years now to try and solve the problems on the Tier relating to the chaos caused by the clash between mountain bike traffic, and the walking public in the old carpark. After many meetings, possible solutions and discussions it was finally decided that a total separation of the two groups was the only solution.

The result was a new plan to designate an area at the entrance of the plateau, for minimal car parking and a bus drop off area to deliver riders and then leave. Break O'Day council then submitted a plan with parking for 24 cars and 6 buses, an area 80 by 30 metres, around 5 times bigger than the old car park. We rejected this outright, considering it to be a huge blot on the landscape and very destructive on the visual, physical, and heritage values of the area.

This plan was then reduced to parking for 12 cars, and 4 buses, and released at the beginning of June as a Development Application, with a 7-day time frame for submissions or comments on the plan, allowing very little time to respond to such a large and detailed plan. We consider the new plan to be equally unacceptable.

On further reading of the details on the DA for the proposed new car park, we are very disappointed and angry to read that we were "very supportive of the plan".....this is patently untrue, as we most definitely are not !

While we support and appreciate the changes in signage for walking tracks, the realignment of MTB Starting points, and the changes on the information panels, we most definitely do not support the monstrous car park proposal as submitted by council, and want readers to know this.

We were, and are still, hoping for a drastic reduction of the size of the plan, to allow only a minimal number of car parking spaces, if any at all. All that is needed is a u-shaped bus driveway section to drop off riders and then leave. As all MTB tracks on the tier are one way only, ie down and out, it is totally unnecessary for buses to park or wait for return riders, as there won't be any, so there is no need for any parking spaces for buses. As for car parking, it has been emphasized by Ben Pettman, manager of tracks, that the vast majority of riders will be using the bus service, therefore car parking spaces should be minimal.

It is very disappointing that council is focusing more on developing all the features of a theme park for an elite group, and at great expense, rather than the preservation of the natural beauty and heritage values of such a unique area as the Tier.




### BOOK REVIEW— BETWEEN A WOLF AND A DOG

Our book this past month was the novel *Between a Wolf and a Dog* by Australian writer Georgia Blain. This book was very well received by the group and all admired the beautiful style of this author who unfortunately died a couple of years ago, just a few days before her mother, the well known broadcaster and writer Anne Deveson, also died. Normally it is not a good idea to try to connect a writer's prose with her biographical details but in this case I make an exception because this time, by chance, art bleakly imitates life. The mother character in the story is terminally ill with a brain tumour and it was while Blain was editing her novel that she discovered she herself had a brain tumour.

This novel is ultimately a snapshot of our times. It is a story of a family caught up in the common dilemmas of modern Australian life and presents a group of flawed but totally believable and authentic characters. Set in Sydney the action takes place over just one rainy 24 hour period with background filled in by regular flashbacks. One of the two daughters, Ester, is a psychotherapist and we experience 5 of her therapy sessions. These clients also present as reflections of the angst and concerns of modern life. Problems such as school aversion, post natal depression, relationship crises, death and loneliness are all present in her consulting room. Ester has always been the responsible sister while April, the musician, has led a life of erratic impulse. Ester is married to Lawrence whom she has thrown out after two (!) betrayals with sister April. He is a pollster who is "cooking" the results of political polls to favour one Party over the other. How current, we all thought! It seems that he has never really taken responsibility for his actions, relying on his looks and charisma to charm people. Suddenly at his lowest ebb he is presented with a chance to show his adult side: Hilary, the artist mother of April and Ester, has decided to end her life before her disease becomes unbearable and asks Lawrence to be the one to find her after she has overdosed and then to break the news to her. The novel ends with Lawrence on his way to her house and we are left to wonder about the ramifications of what might happen.

Although the themes of grief, death, honesty and responsibility may sound heavy Blain's wonderful light touch brings these people to life on the page and we could all identify with their problems and situations. The constant presence of the rain reflected sometimes the discomfort of the characters and at other times seemed like a cleansing and renewing force of Nature. We highly recommend this novel for its style, characterisation and relevance to modern life.
