FINGAL LANDMARK RENOVATIONS NEARLY COMPLETED

As work continues on the Old Tasmania Hotel, which houses the Fingal Valley Neighbourhood House, the date when it will be re-opened draws nearer. As these photographs show, the stairwell and hallway have been refreshed, and



automatic sliding glass doors will allow unimpeded access, while retaining the warmth in winter, and the heat out in summer. As part of the renovation, reverse-cycle air conditioner units have been installed throughout, and will enable the House to be kept at a constant temperature, providing better comfort for both staff and visitors to the House, including clients of services providing counselling and advice, such as Launceston Community Legal Centre, and Counselling and Consulting Services Tasmania.



Most of the restoration work has taken place upstairs, including a meeting room and office spaces, which will allow for on-going training and privacy, and in the future, an area for emergency accommodation. Rooms are also available to be hired for visiting services, and the Valley and East Coast Voice will occupy new office space upstairs.



Workmen on the site have expressed surprise at how well the building has been preserved in some areas, but how original construction methods meant unexpected remedial work needed to be undertaken before the planned work could proceed. Previous efforts at maintenance also caused minor delays, but they were quickly dealt with, and made no difference to the work that needed to be completed.



As noted on the Fingal Valley Neighbourhood House page, the office will be open from next Monday, 13th July, with the official opening taking place later in the year. We look forward to these new spaces being available shortly. The staff and volunteers look forward to providing assistance to the public in a refreshed environment.

ROAD TO RECOVERY AND DROUGHT RELIEF FUNDING FOR BREAK O'DAY

Local road maintenance in Break O'Day will receive a boost thanks to funding under the Morrison Coalition Government's Roads to Recovery Program.

Liberal Senator for Tasmania, Claire Chandler, said Break O'Day Council will receive \$280,000 as part of the "Roads to Recovery" funding, which will allow the council to progress high-priority projects and deliver upgraded local roads. In a press release, Senator Chandler noted that "The Morrison Coalition Government is committed to providing better road infrastructure to improve travel times and make it safer for people to travel on our roads." Later in the statement, she added, "We are investing in infrastructure right across the country to lay the foundations for economic recovery on the other side of the COVID-19 pandemic. Helping local councils maintain and improve roads under their jurisdiction is a big part of that. The Federal Government is committed to providing vital infrastructure and services through a range of programs to local councils including the newly created \$500 million Local Road and Community Infrastructure Program, Financial Assistance Grants, the Bridges Renewal, Black Spot, Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity and Roads to Recovery programs." More information on these programs is available at www.infrastructure.gov.au.

Under the expanded Drought Communities program, communities in Break O'Day and Glamorgan Spring Bay will benefit from \$2 million in additional Liberal National Government funding to support community infrastructure and other drought-relief projects. 11 projects across the two municipalities will improve community amenity by investing in a range of local infrastructure upgrades.

Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management David Littleproud MP said the program would create jobs in communities which have been impacted by drought. "Make no mistake, we're standing shoulder-to-shoulder with drought-hit communities on the East Coast of Tasmania," Minister Littleproud said. "We've committed more than \$8 billion to drought and that includes investments to make our communities resilient and better prepared for the next drought. The \$2 million we're spending in Break O'Day and Glamorgan Spring Bay will run right through the community when workers have more money to spend at the local shops."

Liberal Senator for Tasmania, Claire Chandler, said the Drought Communities Program will help keep local economies going even through the tough times caused by the drought. "While there's been welcome recent rainfall, 18 months of drought followed by the COVID-19 crisis has had a serious impact on the cash flow for local business and employment opportunities for workers," Senator Chandler said. This program helps keep people working and cash-flow going in local businesses, by assisting local councils to deliver community infrastructure upgrades they've identified as priorities. This investment is a great example of how this Liberal National Government is delivering long-lasting benefits to communities through investment in both the DCP and our broader drought support package."

FVNH will be open on Monday 13th from the Old Tasmanian Hotel.

We will be observing social distancing and limiting numbers into the house during this time.

We are excited that the building restoration works are almost complete and hope to be able to open these new spaces soon.

We will advise in coming weeks the re-introduction of activities including the Op Shop, Tai Chi, Bread, Legal Literacy and Garden.

Loaves and Fishes **will now be available on Wednesdays from 12pm until further notice and be available from the Op Shop room until further notice.**

OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

- We continue to provide information, advice and support to the community via phone, email and social media;
- **Food Relief** will be provided (we are considering how the food is packaged and collected and what risk is presented);
- Suspending all non-essential transport
- All non-essential staff, contractors and volunteers to work off site.
- Provide essential transport for our most vulnerable to medical appointments.
- Staff and volunteers will complete a Self-Assessment Tool to ensure they are not at risk if they choose to come in;
- All group activities have been postponed;
- NILS Loans will continue to be offered via phone, email and, in rare cases, in the large room;
- Centrelink assistance on request and by appointment
- Cleaning will be more focussed on surfaces, entrances, keyboards, phones etc

CHANGES TO EAST COAST BUS SERVICES ANNOUNCED

On Sunday 5 July 2020, three new Saturday services between Bicheno and St Marys will be introduced. The new services include a service departing St Marys at 8:40am and arriving at Bicheno at 9:25am, a service departing Bicheno at 5:00pm and arriving at St Marys at 5:45pm, and a service departing Coles Bay at 7:35pm and arriving at Bicheno at 8:10pm. In addition to this, the weekday (route 742) school holiday service from Bicheno to St Marys will start departing at 5:00pm, instead of 4:00pm.

These changes have been made following feedback from Calows Coaches about opportunities to further improve East Coast services, particularly on weekends, and may affect the travel arrangements of current bus passengers. People can also call the operator of their bus service for more information.

A MESSAGE FROM THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

The parish administration of the sacraments is still open to the Catholic Christian Faithful, provided that we observe the restrictions as to the number of those people attending the baptism, wedding or funeral mass inside the church. However, in case of the funeral, those who wish to attend the funeral service, can attend at the grave site where they will keep the distance from each other as prescribed by the government.



MOUNT ELEPHANT AND BEYOND BOOK GROUP

BOOK REVIEW

Once again our Book Group had to make do with a Zoom meeting. This time we decided that members should speak about books that we had recently read and this proved interesting.


I chose to talk about *The Age of Innocence*, something of a classic, written in 1920 by the American writer, Edith Wharton (1862-1937). She was the first woman to win the Pulitzer Prize for Literature. Some of her other novels are *The House of Mirth*, *Ethan Frome* and *The Gilded Age*. Wharton was born into a wealthy New York family named Jones, and it is claimed that it is her family that is referred to in the expression "keeping up with the Joneses." She mixed with the elite of society and was also friends with the writer Henry James (*Portrait of a Lady*), travelled widely in Europe and enjoyed the advantages of wealth and education.

Wharton sets *The Age of Innocence* in "Old" New York in 1870, fifty years before. Her characters belong to the upper echelons of the society at the time, the leaders being descendants of the Dutch founders of the city, whose names are still familiar today- Stuyvesant, Rockefeller etc. This was a very narrow slice of the population, but it wielded great power and influence and sought to preserve a way of life and attitudes that were to change greatly by the turn of the century, and then during the First World War. Indeed, the ending of the novel leaps ahead thirty years and we can recognise the changes that have occurred for this particular class. Entrepreneurs and "adventurers" have brought in "new money", and are very much looked down upon by the old elite. Snobbery and hypocrisy are rampant!

The story centres on a young man, Newland Archer, and his fiancée, May Welland. Their marriage will unite two of the respected New York families, and all appears to be following in the very predictable path of such a union. There are perhaps only a dozen of these families, and the rules of what they regard as respectability and propriety are smotheringly enforced. Of course there is much hypocrisy and inequality between men and women. Newland Archer is well educated and reads widely and fancies himself as something of a free thinker, whereas May is apparently the typical young woman of her class with no aspirations to a life of the mind, and expects to follow the conventional path, supervising her household staff, holding dinners and attending balls, and providing heirs to the family fortune with the occasional archery competition.

Suddenly there appears on the scene Countess Ellen Olenska, cousin of May. She has led a rather bohemian life in Europe, has married a Polish count from whom she is now fleeing after rumoured dark experiences, and claims she simply wants to return to the bosom of her extended family and become one of them. Newland is fascinated by her; to him she represents Europe, art, literature and culture, which he longs for in a vague, unarticulated way. He begins to dream of the different and exciting life he would have if he ran away with her back to Europe, not realising that he would lose everything-wealth, family support and respect- if he did this.


The novel is a wonderful study of the people, the houses, the social mores of the place and time. I won't reveal any more about how the plot unfolds. You will just have to read the novel! Failing that there was a beautiful, lush film made of it in the 1990s, starring Daniel Day Lewis, Winona Ryder and Michelle Pfeiffer.





In an effort to make long-term savings for our ratepayers, Council has decided to take over the collection of waste in our municipality. Stay connected - a range of online and offline activities and groups to keep people connected and active

Stay healthy - advice and links for how to stay healthy during this crisis.

LGBTIQ+ people sometimes have more limited options for connecting with others and seeking support, especially in more regional and remote parts of Tasmania. These may shrink even further with the current conditions that have resulted from the COVID-19 pandemic. Uncertainty about whether services and people are inclusive, understanding and respectful can also mean LGBTIQ+ people don't seek help as often as they should, or don't get the right kind of help when they do ask.

RAINBOWS AND RADISHES

GARDENING FOR WINTER VEGETABLES

Hello to everyone out there; if you are all wondering what to do on these cold sunny days, put on an extra pullover & get out in your garden.

We are half way through winter and all the bulbs are showing lovely fresh growth in our gardens.

I have jonquils flowering, how lovely to see the gold & white blooms in the flower beds, not to mention the beautiful perfume that comes with them.

The vegie patch will need some love and care. Don't forget to put some compost, blood & bone into new beds! If you have peas, onions, or beans to put in your vegie beds, the soil will also benefit from a light dressing of lime. If you have grown silver beet, chard, cauliflowers, stir-fry vegies, lettuce, or herbs etc, please do not forget to give them a weekly feed of liquid fertiliser and sea-weed solution every two or three weeks; they will thank you for it and put on some nice growth.

I have a lot of purple broccoli that have come up by themselves, there are far too many to transplant, but I let the young leaves grow to about 12 or 15 centimetres of the many plants that are excess to our needs. They are then sautéed in a little garlic & butter. Never get rid of any of these young Brassica vegie plants, if you have an extra abundance they can be eaten this way and are a lovely addition to soups and stir fries.

It is time to grow asparagus crowns, early potatoes, spring onions, shallots, potato onions, salad onions and garlic cloves, Jerusalem & globe artichokes, broad beans, spinach, chives, coriander - to spice up your curries & salads, and the list goes on, there is an abundance to keep you busy on the days you may want to spend in your garden.

Oh, and don't forget the radishes!


